- Operate nationally and across geopolitical zones (North-East, North-Central, North-West, South-South, South-East, and South-West).

Influence climate policy through youth activism at local and national levels in Nigeria.

- Empower youth by providing knowledge, skills, and resources to be effective agents of change in the fight against climate change.
- Advocate for youth-inclusive climate policies and initiatives at local, national, and international levels.
- Conduct awareness campaigns, workshops, and educational programs to educate young Nigerians about climate change and sustainable practices.
- Facilitate community-level projects promoting sustainable livelihoods, renewable energy adoption, and environmental conservation.
- Empower the youth movement to have an influential relationship with the government.
- Liaise between the Ministry of Water and Environment, foreign missions in Nigeria, development and UN agencies, and their engagement with young people on climate policy.

The involvement of Nigeria in the YCCGA retreat at COP28 signals a commitment to ensuring the youth's active participation in shaping the nation's climate policies and fostering sustainable practices for a greener future.
